<b>Description</b>			
<i>Provide a short description of the event and its activities.</i>			
<p>The second event carried out as part of the project “European Culture: All Different – All Equal” took place in Serock on September 6, 2024. Delegates from the Czech Republic and Lithuania and Latvia visited Serock. The project focused on promoting the idea of equality and diversity among different cultures, emphasizing that all people, regardless of their differences, should be treated equally. The first part of the event was a seminar entitled “Art as a Tool for Promoting Cultural Diversity”, led by Ms. Małgorzata Minchberg, a renowned visual artist, who talked about her international experiences in combining art and cultures. The next item on the program was an animation by Mr. Michał Niewiadomski, who, using a universal language and pantomime, showed the guests that art magically connects people. Then, all participants, speakers, guests and artists had the opportunity to paint an intercultural picture, on which everyone could leave their artistic “mark”. After the joint creation, the guests arrived together with the organizers and representatives of the Serock local government participated in a panel discussion entitled "Art as the language of equality" during which we planned further joint events, shared experiences and ideas. The next point of the meeting was a unique lecture entitled "The role of media in promoting diversity and equality" led by Ms. Małgorzata Gołota, a well-known radio journalist and author of many books, who told the guests about the role of media in promoting diversity and equality and touched on exciting topics related to contemporary socio-cultural challenges caused by, among others, climate change. Both the discussion and both lectures sparked a lively discussion among the participants of the meeting and were met with interest and enthusiasm.</p> <p>The meeting ended with a beautiful artistic performance by a group of folk dancers Ms. Ewa Budna-Orłowska and Mr. Bartłomiej Marszałek from the "Poland Folk" group, who took the guests to the world of Polish folk music and dance, integrating them in a joint dance.</p> <p>The event was attended by delegates from Lithuania, Latvia and the Czech Republic, artists from Poland who had the opportunity to create paintings during artistic residencies in cities participating in the project, representatives of the Serock local government, including the mayor of the City and Commune of Serock – Mr. Artur Borkowski, and representatives of the local Cultural Center in Serock.</p> <p>It was difficult to maintain gender balance as more women wanted to participate in events.</p> <p>The total number of people participating in the project event was 35.</p> <p>Materials and reports from events in the Serock commune were published on the special website European Culture: All different - all equal and disseminated on the website of the Serock City and Commune Office.</p>
